Though summer is over and autumn is here, please come to the club throughout the year. Hope to see you at the turkey dinner!

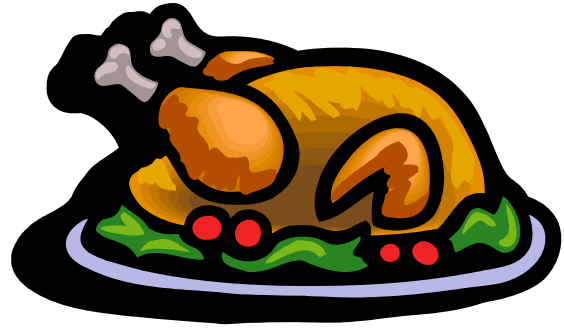


I'd Rather Be Boating!
